








Case Inception

- Review applicable jury instructions
- Develop storyline, themes, & labels
- Case strengths and weaknesses (factual & legal)
- Unknowns
- Develop case strategy and risk assessment/exposure







Case Development with the Jury in Mind

Discovery

- Have a plan/strategy
- Know the purpose
- Offense vs. defense
- Know the Codes (CCP/Evidence)



"I ask the witness to quit taking advantage of the fact that his deposition is not being videotaped."

- a) Non-expert discovery (written/depositions)
- b) Expert discovery





Case Development with the Jury in Mind

Pretrial

- WARNING: Check the Local Rules!!
- Santa Clara County by noon last court day before trial L.R. 9(D)
- Alameda County 3 court days before PTC (or trial if none) L.R.3.35
- Motions in Limine
- Witness/Exhibit Lists
- 3. Jury Instruction Requests
- 4. Proposed Special Verdicts
- 5. Stipulations
- Statement of the Case
- 7. Trial Briefs * Exhibits lodged, not filed (when known)
- 8. Glossary (Alameda County)

- 1. Statement of the Case/Mini Opening
- Exhibit/Witness List
- 3. Jury Questionnaire
- 4. Jury Instructions/VerdictForms
- 5. Exhibits

 - Demonstratives/Technology




